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Unemployed people were over the moon when the government announced that from May 2020 all unemployed people will receive R350 for six months.




To many vulnerable people this came as a relief as they thought hunger would be elevated. The South African Post Office Bank got the contract from government to distribute these COVID-19 relief grants.




But the Post Office never improved it's own infrastructure to accommodate the thousands of people who applied.
